Cotswold Teak Furniture

Teak is one of the hardest and oiliest timbers in the world, which gives it unparalleled durability. Cotswold teak is constructed from grade one plantation teak (there are 8 grades of teak, with one being the best quality). Cotswold teak is approved by the 'World Care Organisation', an institution devoted to the preservation of natural stands of tropical hardwood forests.

What makes this teak so good?

The furniture is made from older trees which are rich in natural oils which give teak its unique lasting properties. This timber is kiln dried before being cut into the furniture - this means the finished product will not warp or split when placed out in the weather. The furniture is made using mortice and tenon joints for strength and is secured with teak dowels and brass screws which will not rust. All components of the furniture are matched for colour giving an end product which is an attractive honey blonde colour.

Cared for effectively, this teak will last you a lifetime.

Your Cotswold teak furniture can be left untreated out in the weather where it will age to a soft silvery grey colour. It will not roughen up, split or splinter if left untreated.

If you prefer the honey colour of the timber, you may treat it with teak oil every 4 - 6 months to maintain the colour. Treating teak with oil will darken it by about 2 shades. Teak oil is only a colouring agent for the wood and will not affect the amazing lasting properties of the timber.

You can clean your teak furniture with hot soapy water and a scrubbing brush.

Where is the timber from?

The timber used in this furniture comes from managed forests in Asia.
